ELA: Students will begin Unit 3 in their ELA curriculum, with the big idea focus, asking the question “How are the results of our efforts sometimes greater than we expect? The first selection is called “Hatchet,” then “When Marian Sang,” and ending the month with “Learning to Swim.” Text-Based Comprehension will be sequence, background knowledge, generalization, questioning, predicting, and setting a purpose

MATH: Students will continue Topic 1, Understand Numerical and Algebraic Expressions in their EnVision math workbook. Students will learn how to evaluate numerical expressions and identify parts of an expression. Please make sure students are utilizing their independent math program Moby Max.

SCIENCE: Students will continue Unit 2: Metabolism. Students will play the role of medical students as they try to diagnose and analyze a new patient named Elisa. Parental Tips: Research and discuss what is metabolism and how does exercise affect your metabolism.

SOCIAL STUDIES: Students will begin Unit 2 The Ancient Near East focusing on the consequences of technology. In chapter 2 we learn about the Fertile Crescent, the civilization of Sumer, and other first empire’s rise and fall. We will discover what Hammurabi’s Code “Eye for an Eye” means. Finally we will explore the Assyrian and Persian Empires.
